


St Mary's Church, Woodkirk

Christmas Tree Festival 2022 Information

Friday 2nd - Sunday 4th December 2022



The weekend shares the Saturday with the St Mary's Christmas Fair taking place in the Parish Centre and so visitors will be able to go to both on the Saturday, increasing footfall.

There is no charge for having a tree at the festival.

Arrangements

Setup will be from 5pm to 8pm on Thursday 1st December.

Most of the trees will be situated on boards at the edge of the church running down the length of the church; this provides an easy way for visitors to look at all the trees.

The church will decide the location of trees in order to provide a mix of organisations. We will provide a name sign for your organisation which will stand in front of your tree.

The festival will be open at the following times:

Friday 2nd December:	4.00 - 8.00pm
Saturday 3rd December:	10.00am - 6.00pm
Sunday 4th December:	12.00pm until after the child friendly carol service with refreshments between 4.00 and 5.00pm

Tea and coffee will be available in the church throughout the festival.


You will be able to take down your tree on Monday 5th December between 5.00 and 7.00pm

Tree Specifications

You need to decorate your tree to a design which reflects your organisation.

It is essential for health and safety, and to provide a consistent display, that the following specifications are adhered to:

- Trees should be artificial
- Trees should be between 4' and 6'
- Lights should be low-powered LED, be in good condition, and run off batteries. Spare batteries should be left should they run out. At the end of each day, the lights will be turned off.
