**The next Advent Reflection Service on the theme of Peace will be on Weds 9<sup>th</sup> December at 7.00pm** and will be streamed live. Why not give it a try? make yourself comfortable, light a candle and take some quiet time.



There are two trees at the entrance to the church. **These are memory/prayer trees** – please bring a bauble and write a loved ones name (in indelible ink) either in loving memory or for prayers to be said.

As I said in my last notice sheet Christmas is not cancelled, we need more than ever to acknowledge the greatest story ever told and however we celebrate it this year, it will not take away from the birth of Christ more than

2,000 years ago. Jesus was the world's hope then and He is still the hope of the world today. He is the light in the darkness and as such the clergy in this area are using the picture below and are asking their communities to light up their windows symbolising the hope in our world today during these dark winter months and in the midst of the pandemic.



This picture is being made into a banner and will go on the back wall of the Stable that Dave is has been building. The Stable will have the finishing touches put to it on Saturday and will be ready for when church re-opens on Sunday.

If anyone would like me to send the picture to them so that they can print it off and put it in their window with some white lights then please email me and let me know. I will print off some in due course for when church opens.

#### Advent Gifts/Christmas Cards

At this time of year we usually ask if people want to buy St Mary's Church an Advent Gift and I put a list in church with the consumables we use in church such as candles, wafers, wine etc etc. Times are hard at the moment and as we have not used many consumables this past year we are not asking for any gifts this year.

Last year quite a few members of the church donated money to St Mary's Church instead of buying Christmas Cards for each other. If you want to do that again this year then please let me know and I will ensure that a Christmas Message from you is either put in church or on the Notice Sheet. Please do not bring cards to church and leave them for other people – it is not COVID safe to do so (Thank you).

#### Do you know how the Robin acquired its distinctive red breast?

Legend has it that on that first Christmas night the temperature dropped in Bethlehem, and the air became bitterly cold. The small fire that burned in the middle of the stable was nearly out, and Mary began to worry as the baby Jesus shivered in her arms.

Joseph had gone to find firewood and, in his absence, Mary turned to the animals about her and asked for help. The strong ox lay sound asleep on the stable floor and did

not hear her. Nor did the hardworking donkey, or the stately horse. Mary wondered what to do.

Suddenly she heard the fluttering of wings and looking up, she saw a small, plain, brown-coloured bird fly into the stall. The bird went directly over the dying fire and began to flap his wings hard.

His tiny wings acted like little bellows, puffing air on the embers, until they glowed bright red again. The bird continued to fan the fire, singing all the while, until the ashes began to kindle.

Then with his beak, the bird began picking up dry sticks and dropping them into the fire. As he did, a flame burst forth and burned the little bird's breast bright red. But he simply continued to feed the fire until it crackled brightly and warmed the entire stable. The baby Jesus slept happily.

Mary thanked the bird for his selfless act. Then she looked tenderly at his red breast, burned by the flame, and promised the robin that from now on his red breast would be a reminder of how he saved Jesus from the bitter cold, and a sign to the world of the hope that acts of kindness bring.

The legend of the robin teaches us a valuable lesson – not to be overwhelmed by the size of the mission in front of us, or to think ourselves too small to make a difference. Rather, we must do what we can to bring hope to the world.

If you are able to donate a toy I would be very grateful and as above they can be dropped off at church on Weds and Sun services, or at the Vicarage (anytime) or if you want a toy collected from you (COVID securely) then please do not hesitate to call me (as above) and I will make sure they go the Salvation Army in time for Christmas. The last day these can be donated is Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> December.
