This past week has been a fairly busy and stressful week as our Parish Hall once again opens to the community. We are governed by the Guidelines set by the Government/Church of England/Leeds Diocese. As with the church the Parish Hall has its own risk assessment which has been completed and agreed at PCC. As well as the Risk Assessment we have a responsibility to each group to hand over a COVID secure building to them and so there is lots of cleaning to be done. Each group has been given a list of Special Conditions which they must agree too before the hall can be let to them and it is each group's responsibility to wipe down and sanitise anything they touch or use. The building is then cleaned by a volunteer at given times of the week as well as by Gillian our cleaner who does such a fantastic job.

The only group that are allowed into the Parish Hall at the moment are those of an educational nature, so St Mary's Playgroup, Baby Sensory and Joy have returned this week and met for the first time. There are strict regulations about wearing a mask and numbers within the building and now in the light of the latest Government announcement of six individuals we need to be even more stringent in how we manage this building.

The Cubs, Beavers and Scouts are only in a position to meet outside of the building but will access the toilets of the Parish Hall and as yet the rainbows and brownies are not in a position to return.

Groups that have not yet returned are those at greatest risk ABC, Keep Fit, and Young at Heart and we will review this with the intention of offering reopening in January but this all depends on what happens as we progress into winter and what the Government dictates.

As it stands the Parish Hall cannot be let for parties.

I know that I miss the get togethers we all had sharing food, fun and laughter and it is difficult not being able to do the things that until now we have taken for granted but the safety and wellbeing of all concerned is of utmost importance.

As I write this on Saturday I have now completed 11 days of the sponsored walk and at the end of Day 10 – I had walked 99 miles which does indeed seem an incredible amount.

I have been extremely lucky with the weather so far and haven't been rained on once. It takes me about 2.5 hours to walk the 21,000 steps needed per day to reach 15km so it is important for me to keep the intent to walk with graciousness. Do I always manage that? No lol but I try.

Local schools have returned this week and as yet I only know that Hilltop have pencilled in for us to begin worship in school again in November again. They will not be holding their Harvest Festival in Church this year but are going to collect food for the local foodbank again.

As we begin to think about Harvest then this will be celebrated in Church on Sunday 11th October and I will keep you updated as to how we will do this nearer the time.

I have been busy this week with the interment of ashes and there are funerals coming up in the next couple of weeks. As always there are still limitations on these occasions which we must comply with.
