So this is the week we have heard of the Government's plan to come out of lockdown and for each of us this will mean different things. As a Vicar, I have to bear in mind not only Government Guidelines but also Guidelines from the Church of England and Guidelines given by our Bishop, Bishop Nick.

The Guidelines by the Government indicate that places of worship will be "open" in stage three of their plan beginning on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July providing there is no increase in the infection rate. Guidelines by the Church of England indicate that Priests can now go into church buildings for private prayer and to stream services provided they follow a 7 page document of how to make your building safe after a lockdown and following strict procedures for deep cleaning. Guidelines by Bishop Nick are on the same wavelength yes priests can go back into church for prayer and streaming of services on condition all necessary hygiene precautions are taken but that Clergy must make it clear to their congregations that this does not mean that Clergy being in the church building does not open the doors for others to join them. However, Bishop Nick goes on to say that if Clergy do not feel that this is the time to re-enter church then we do not have too at this point and that it may be better to have some consistency and status quo if the government has to retighten lockdown in the face a future spike in infections and use this time as a period of reflection.

What does "open" church look like in July? No-one really knows yet but it won't be open as we are used to. There will be no quick return to worship on a Sunday morning in the church building.

At the minute and for the immediate future church has to be deep cleaned after even I have entered the building and so this next week I will go about the task of reopening the building in a safe way, running water, flushing toilets each day, checking alarms, boilers and heating systems. A deep clean will take place of the church building by myself and in anticipation of the church at some point being opened for private prayer or limited funerals etc, I am making the decision to remove all soft furnishings and footstools as these are the things that cannot be deep cleaned easily. All bibles, hymn books, postcards, gift aid envelopes will be put into storage so that no book or piece of paper can be handled by more than one person. The red chairs at the back will be put away and not used. If we need extra chairs, I will bring the new ones from the church hall which can be wiped over.

This will make deep cleaning more effective and efficient in the immediate future.

Bishop Nick has asked us to think about four questions A) what have I/we lost in the last two months that must remain lost? B) what has been lost in the last few months that we must regain in the weeks and months ahead? C) what has been gained in the last few months that must now be retained or developed? D) what has been gained that was fine for the season but can now be lost?

If you have any thoughts on this please email them to me for consideration by the PCC.

Finally this week, I am taking some time off, I feel tired and drained and hope to recharge my batteries for a few days so there will be no services next week.

We will continue to have a virtual coffee morning at 10.30am on Saturday mornings on Zoom. If you haven't attended and would like to join in then you will then need to email me so that I can let you have the access codes to enter the coffee morning.

Gail and I have kept in touch with all of you and so far everyone seems to be well and have the things they need.

Please continue to pray for Nancy, Eileen and Liz.
