Church Re-Opening for Private Prayer and Funerals ONLY

As per the Government and Church of England guidelines we have been able to open the church this past week for Private Prayer ONLY. We have notified our local Funeral Directors that we are able now to carry out funerals. A complete risk assessment has been completed and is available to view on our church website (www.stmarywoodkirk.org).

We opened twice last week for private prayer and a number of people attended on both occasions. We will be open again this next week on Monday 29th June 10.00am-12noon, and Thursday 2nd July 6.00pm-8.00pm. Please remember that Bathrooms will be closed for the time being and you are welcome to bring a cushion and a bible or prayer book on the understanding that only you touch them and you take them home. You will be asked to sanitize your hand on entry and exit into the church.

You are welcome to bring your own bible and cushion on the understanding that only you touch them and take them home.

We have twelve pews available to sit in – if you live alone then only you can sit in a pew, if you are married or in a bubble then you can share a pew.

If you have any symptoms of COVID or are in quarantine then please do not enter into church at this time as others

will be put at risk. If you are in a vulnerable category then again please take care and follow government guidelines.

Church will not be open at other times and no-one (Workmen, PCC members and Volunteers) are to enter without explicit permission from the Vicar who needs to keep a record of those who enter for a specific purpose.

SO when will we be open for worship?

Government guidelines state that churches can open for worship from the 4th July. However, “can” does not mean we will. It is important we wait for the Church of England to issue the appropriate guidelines, although from a Health and Safety and COVID perspective we are happy that we have complied with all guidelines and that a thorough risk assessment has been carried out so that we can keep you as safe as possible and that the church environment is as risk free as possible.

However, there are a few technical issues of how we merge streaming with live worship? What sort of worship should we offer? There will be no singing allowed and guidelines state contact should be kept to a minimum so maybe a said Eucharist or said Service instead? Should this be at 10.30am or should we stream the 10.30am with hymns as we do now and then hold a said service in the afternoon so people can attend? To keep people safe, do we need to take bookings for seats and have two services? These are complicated issues and need further discussion with the PCC – the next meeting of which is on 13th July.

Therefore, at this point in time I am unable to give you a definite date of when we will reopen for worship on a Sunday but you can rest assured that I and the PCC will continue to work towards the best interests of all concerned and if that means we need to take the time to reassess all that we do then you can be assured that this is in everyone's best interests. If anyone wishes to make comments or suggestions to the PCC then please email them to me for consideration.

We continue to have a virtual coffee morning at 10.30am on Saturday mornings on Zoom. If you haven't attended and would like to join in then you will either need to email me so that I can let you have the access codes to enter the coffee morning or look on our facebook page.

Please continue to pray for those in need that we know.
