We have all had to learn new skills and as you saw it didn't work too well last Sunday – there isn't much unfortunately I can do about the strength of the internet from the house to the church but hopefully I will do better this week.

It has been nice to have some time away – my first real alone time for this year. So what did I do with my time?

Truth is not much really but it was nice not to be governed by the clock or services or the demands of others. On Monday the sun was shining and I enjoyed sitting out on the balcony and having a gin and tonic. I took Lyla for lunch twice once with Matthew and once with Lucy. I met a friend for lunch and spent three hours eating and talking. The rest of the time I literally just munched on the sofa, read a book, watched a little bit of tv, did one or two puzzles and generally just defragged.

One of the nicest things was going for a walk by the river. I walk quite a bit here anyhow and it simply was not possible for me not to go for a walk each day. The rhythm

In the latter part of the week I did join in one or two services and thoroughly enjoyed being ministered to by Gail and Dawn. I had told them that I wouldn't come into live services the early part of the week as I think it makes them more nervous but by the end of the week they were doing so well that I joined in.

I am coming back refreshed and looking forward to seeing some of you through the week.

There will be no Morning Prayer on Monday as it is Bank Holiday and likewise there will be no Private Prayer. In fact Private Prayer comes to an end at the end of August and it will only be reinstated should people not be able to attend services in church. Of course, if anybody would like some private time in church then they should just contact me.

This week will be busy finishing sorting out the Parish Hall ready to open on the 7th September so lots to do.

Sponsored walk by the Vicar

Throughout the month of September, I am planning to walk 15km a day which for 30 days equates to 450km. This will be a total of 279 miles walked during this next month. If you would like to sponsor me or make a donation at the end of September this would raise much needed funds for the East Window Fund.

In the coming months the PCC have agreed to have a Specialist look at the East Window and prepare a report on its condition and the cost to make the necessary repairs.
